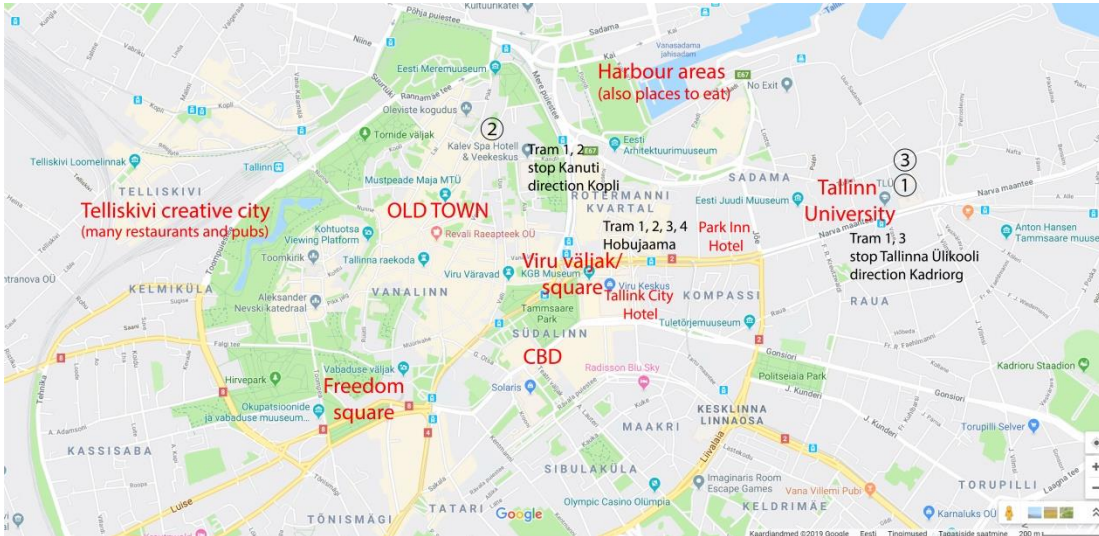

Tram 4 takes you from the airport to city centre (Hobujaama stop at Viru väljak/square)

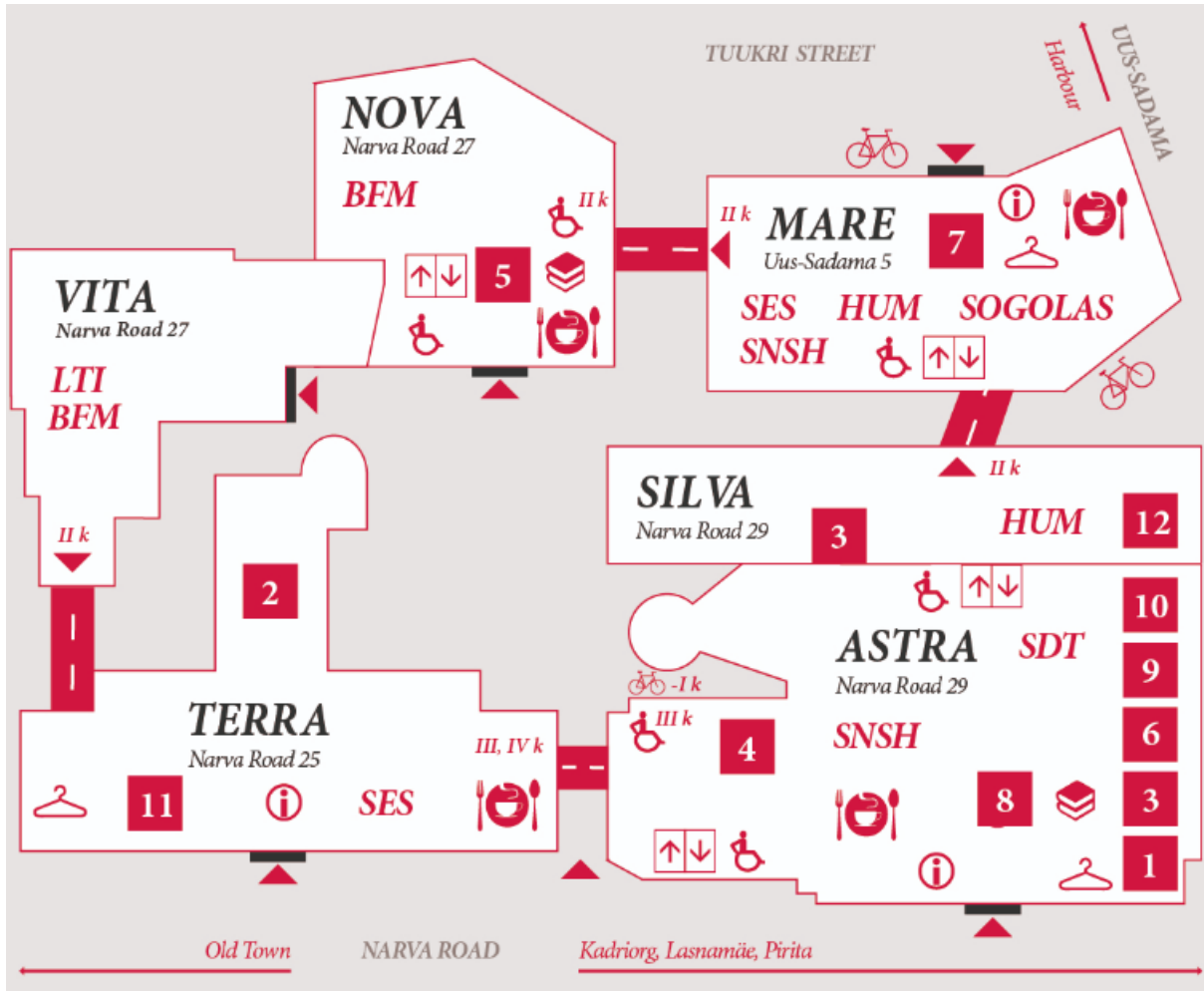
Bus 2 takes you from the airport to city centre (A. Laikmaa stop at Viru väljak/square)
